Our efforts work to mitigate the widespread impact of human trafficking on victims and our community.

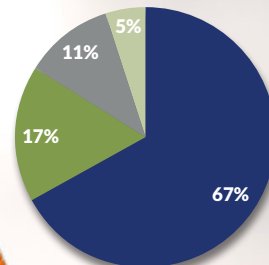

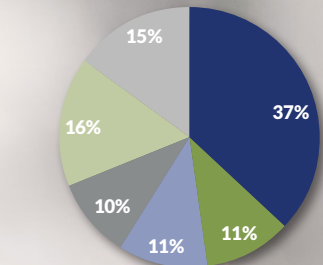
