## Education Impact

### ► Change in knowledge and preparedness:

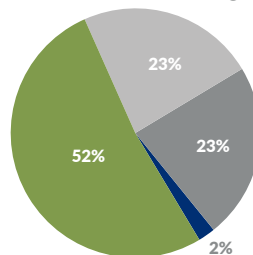
Nearly all respondents (98%) indicated their knowledge of human trafficking increased after attending the presentation. The majority of respondents (90%) indicated they felt more prepared to identify human trafficking compared to before the presentation.

### ► Satisfaction:

90-95% of participants were highly satisfied with the information they received.

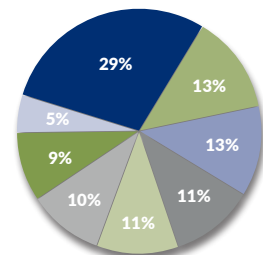
### INCOME SOURCES
