# Too many people are affected by labor and sex trafficking in our community.

They may be at high risk of being trafficked, currently enduring it, or recovering from past exploitation. To address and ultimately end human trafficking, our community is enhancing its ability to identify and prosecute offenders, expanding capacity to support and empower survivors, and strengthening efforts to prevent trafficking before it occurs. This comprehensive approach is among our community's most critical work, and the Collaborative to End Human Trafficking is dedicated to driving these efforts forward.

## Support, Equip, Facilitate: **Building Hope Through Housing**

The need for trauma-informed supportive housing in Northeast Ohio is urgent. This year, we convened 30 partners, including survivors and service providers, for a Learning Trip to Harriet's Hope in Columbus – a 52-unit permanent supportive housing community for survivors. This visit inspired stakeholders to explore innovative housing solutions for our region, turning aspirations into actionable strategies for survivor care and empowerment.

## Shining a Bright Light: **Expanding Awareness and Education**

In 2023/24, we reached 14,120 people through 75 education, training programs and outreach, which included schools, healthcare, law enforcement, and community groups. A highlight was Human Trafficking Prevention Month in January 2024, during which we engaged more than 10,000 individuals through targeted outreach and programs.
