Introduction

January is Human Trafficking Prevention Month, a presidentially designated observance that raises awareness about human trafficking and calls on all sectors to take action to prevent exploitation before it occurs.

This toolkit is designed to support individuals, organizations, and coalition partners in advancing a **prevention-centered approach** to human trafficking. Rather than focusing solely on awareness or response, it emphasizes the importance of addressing root causes, strengthening protective factors, and building coordinated strategies that reduce vulnerability to exploitation.

Human trafficking does not occur in isolation. It is deeply connected to other forms of violence and harm, including sexual violence, child maltreatment, intimate partner violence, online abuse, and economic instability. These forms of violence often share common risk factors and frequently occur within the same communities, households, or across the lifespan. Prevention requires us to **connect the dots** and move beyond siloed approaches.

Structured around four key focus weeks, this toolkit provides clear messaging and practical ways to engage throughout the month. Each week highlights how prevention operates across the **spectrum of prevention**—from individual knowledge and relationships to community conditions, systems change, and policy. Partners are encouraged to use the resources that best fit their role, capacity, and community context.

Goals

- Increase understanding of human trafficking as a preventable form of violence, not an isolated crime.
- Help individuals and organizations see their role in prevention, from building safe relationships to strengthening systems and policy.
- Highlight how human trafficking is connected to other forms of harm, including sexual violence, child abuse, economic instability, and social isolation.
- Promote upstream prevention strategies that reduce vulnerability and strengthen protective factors.
- Support coordinated action, including accurate reporting, survivor-centered referrals, and prevention-focused policy solutions.



Welcome + How to Use This Toolkit

This toolkit is designed to support coalition partners during Human Trafficking Prevention Month by offering clear messages, resources, and opportunities to engage in prevention. Partners are encouraged to use the pieces that best fit their role, capacity, and community context—whether that means sharing information, attending a training, participating in an event, or supporting prevention-focused policy efforts.

Every action, at any level, helps raise awareness, strengthen prevention, and reduce harm.



Focus Weeks

This toolkit is organized around four focus weeks that reflect a prevention-centered approach to human trafficking. Each week builds on the last, moving from foundational knowledge to collective action. Partners are encouraged to engage in the weeks and activities that best fit their role and capacity.

Week 1: Prevention Starts with Knowledge

Focus: Human Trafficking 101, minors, consent, and the law

Purpose: Build shared understanding and reduce harm caused by misinformation

Week 2: Connecting the Dots

Focus: Prevention as a Public Health Strategy

Purpose: Highlight shared risk factors and the importance of a public health approach to

prevention



Week 3: Power, Demand, and Exploitation

Focus: Buyer accountability, misogyny, and cultural drivers of exploitation

Purpose: Address demand and the social norms that fuel trafficking

Week 4: Prevention Through Policy and Collective Action

Focus: Legislative solutions and systems change

Purpose: Advance prevention-focused policies and coordinated action

Key Messages
